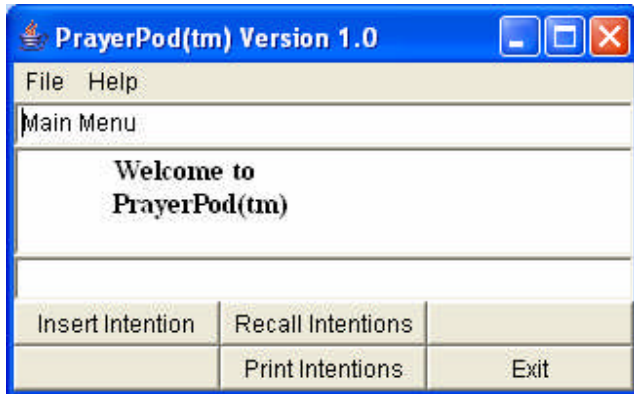


PrayerPod™ User's Guide / Screen Snapshots

The PrayerPod™ software application represents an opportunity for technology to not only improve physical quality of life, but spiritual quality of life as well. This document is a Quick Tour guide to get you off and using your PrayerPod™ software to store your personal prayer intentions.

Main Menu Screen

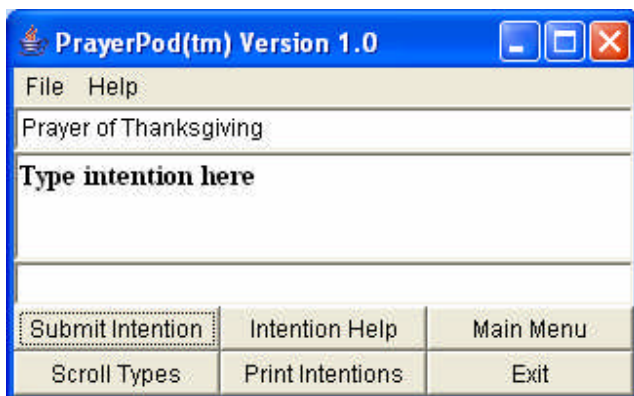


This initial screen is what the user is presented with when the tool is loaded. The Menu options under File offer two useful functions – **loading** a previously saved prayer file, or **saving** to a “named” prayer file. In each case, once the new file has been selected, subsequent additions or deletions to the in-memory prayer list will be saved off to that file. By default, the tool

saves these changes to a file called “default.pry.” The load/save options allow the tool to be used by multiple parties.

Additionally, the main menu provides buttons to enter the insert or recall screens. The functionality of these screens is described in detail next. Finally an option to create a hard-copy printout of the existing intentions is available from the main menu, as well as a button to exit the program.

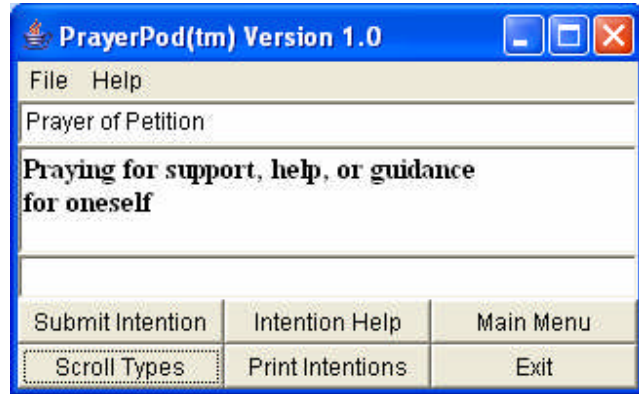
Insert Intention Screen



When the user selects the “Insert Intention” button from the main screen, they are presented with the “Insert Intention Screen” shown here. Initially, the main textual screens look like this, with the text “Type insertion here” emblazoned across the text area where the user is allow to freely type the text of their prayer intention. After approximately 3 seconds, this “helper text” goes away, so the user

can just start typing. The header text identifies the prayer type that the intention will be stored as; selecting the “Scroll Types” button will walk the user through the four main categories of prayer. When the user is satisfied with the text, and the intention type is appropriate, they can hit the “Submit Intention” button to make that intention part of their stored prayer list.

The “Insert Intention Screen” also provides two carry-over buttons from the main screen; the Exit button, which performs as expected, and the “Print Intentions” button to print out the existing prayer listing. Additionally, a button is added to traverse back to the main menu. Finally, the button “Intention Help” is added to provide some more descriptive text for each of the prayer intention categories/types. Once selected, the screen displays help for roughly 3 seconds for the current intention type, and will do the same for subsequent types when scrolling through them.



Recall Intentions Screen



The “Recall Intentions Screen” provides the user the opportunity to scroll through all of the intentions they have stored. The screen initializes by putting the intention type and the prayer intention on the screen for the first intention in the list. The ordering to intentions is: Prayers for Departed Souls, followed by Prayers of Intercession, then Prayers of Petition, and finally

Prayers of Thanksgiving. Individual prayers for each type are alphabetically sorted. Two buttons are provided to scroll forward and backward through the list. As the list is traversed, the screen footer shows how many intentions are stored and which of those you are currently viewing. If at any time you wish to Delete an Intention (for example, you asked for strength through a particular ordeal which has passed), you simply scroll to that intention and then select the “Delete Current” button.

As with the “Insert Intentions Screen” three additional buttons are provided – one to exit the tool, one to go back to the main menu, and the opportunity to produce a hard-copy listing of intentions.
